

Magnolia- Dominic T, for showing fantastic independent learning in maths.


Oak- Clark B, for an amazing start to the term with 100% effort.


A RUDOLPH ADVENTURE!


Glebe Parent/Carer, Baby & Toddler Group

What do we offer? Hello everyone,

We are the Glebe pastoral support team, and are known as 'The Haven Team'. We both have many years' of experience and we keep up to date with our training.Children are referred to us by class teachers with a variety of different needs, once class intervention has been tried. If there is a sustained or sudden serious concern e.g. emotional, social or for bereavement support then we step in sooner to offer assistance and advice. Children are also able to contact us through the worry boxes placed around the school (grey locked letter boxes in the corridors).

We support teachers and TA's with strategies and ideas to help children all the time so in a way the whole team are part of the Haven gang! Teachers are asked to utilise ideas in class first before referring e.g. use of very short focused sensory breaks, calm corner, breathing exercises, check-ins from school staff at playtime, creating a circle of friends etc.

The Haven is a very calm environment for us to support the children and decide the appropriate provision going forward. We also support families when they need us.

With the support of the Thought-Full service we aim to run further parent/carer workshops this term. If you have any topics around your child's emotional wellbeing you would like us to cover - please let us know via the office.

We gave 20 hampers at Christmas and they were very much appreciated. The PTA also help us with our mini food bank and they help us to keep our pre-loved uniform and spare clothes for children in good order. Thankyou PTA!

You may see us on the gate and you are welcome to come and say hello.

School Improvement Summary for parents and

<u>carers</u> Summary of School Improvement Priorities for 2024/25 Top 5:

To continue to advance the opportunities, progress and learning confidence of all disadvantaged pupils in phonics, spelling and Writing.

We are always working on supporting the progress of all children and particularly disadvantaged groups. We have made good progress since the pandemic but still have work to do for some children to help them reach their full potential. We are particularly trying to close the gap in Writing outcomes. Maths and Reading are showing more progress. United Learning have provided some excellent staff training this term for us in areas like the importance of building strong vocabulary to assist with reading and writing development. Teachers and senior leaders monitor closely the provision and progress of all children and we regularly share ideas to support next steps in learning together. We have received praise from advisors in the last six months for our excellent inclusive approach for children with special needs, which has sustained since our successful Ofsted in 2023. All the staff share responsibility and have training in meeting children's additional learning needs. This is a strength at Glebe. Miss. Jackson is our Inclusion leader, if you have any questions, and we have our Pupil Premium Fund rationale on the website.

Refreshing our English teaching approach with the desired outcome that Writing outcomes will rise for all ability groups. Mrs. Peace has created an exciting and engaging revised English curriculum for our whole school with the support of our skilled teaching team. Children have been engaged with some lovely writing projects. Our monitoring has shown good levels of engagement in Writing across the school, improved use of grammar and we are very hopeful of positive progress for all.

Ensure our phonics teaching approach is systematic and successful

Children are all making very good progress across the Lower School in phonics. Miss. Williams leads on phonics provision and regularly assesses children with her team. We teach phonics in small groups and the approach is very focused and fun for the children. Our talented staff team includes teaching assistants and teachers. We have had external additional training and monitoring from the Read, Write, Inc company, whose scheme we follow, and this has been worthwhile. This is another cohesive team, all sharing resources and ensuring children get the most from phonics sessions daily.

Continue to embed our new attendance approach.

We have an Attendance team who meet weekly and consider any support we can offer families if attendance is becoming a concern and impacting on learning. We act pro-actively to support families and to improve attendance, as it is so important. Our attendance was at 92.7% in 2023 and we are currently sustaining 95.7%, which is a great improvement post pandemic. A whole school community effort, thankyou!

Continue to develop Nursery provision.

Our Nursery provision is thriving. Our monitoring has shown great learning progress for children and excellent independence and confidence growing daily. The provision is multi-sensory and planned well across the early learning seven areas of the curriculum. The indoor and outdoor areas are stimulating and well planned to offer children the chance to develop skills to support their development fully. Having a skilled and qualified staff team means that social skills and speaking and listening can be developed and supported in readiness for school. We also have the opportunity to get to know families and to address any special educational needs early on. Miss loakeim is such an enthusiastic and joyful teacher and Mrs. Hooley and the EYFS team all contribute to making our nursery a wonderful place for children. We are very pleased we opened a teacher led nursery!

We hope that was a useful summary for all parent of our main priorities this year. The Governing Body and United Learning analyse school progress regularly and in detail, offer challenge and support us all to ensure the school continues to thrive.
