

# KS2 INTERNET SAFETY POSTER COMPETITION

Dear KS2 Parents,

We are excited to announce that as a follow up from our Safer Internet Day activities on 11/2, we are launching an Internet Safety Poster Competition for all KS2 pupils! This competition is designed to help raise awareness about online safety and encourage children to think about how they can stay safe on the internet.

The competition is based around our three key internet safety rules:

- Zip it Don't share your personal information
- Block it Block harmful or upsetting people or websites
- Flag it Tell an adult if you see something worrying online

We encourage students to create their posters either by hand or digitally, showcasing these important rules. The winning poster design will be displayed in all classrooms around the school.

Submission Deadline: Friday, 28th February. Children can give their entry to their class teacher. We hope this competition will engage the children in important discussions around online safety. Thank you for your support, and we look forward to seeing their creative designs!

## SUPPORTING PARENTS AND CARERS WITH INTERNET SAFETY AT HOME

- 1. Explore together: Ask your child to show you their favourite websites and apps and what they do on them. Listen, show interest and encourage them to teach you the basics of the site or app.
- 2. Chat little and often about online safety: If you're introducing them to new learning websites and apps while school is closed, take the opportunity to talk to them about how to stay safe on these services and in general. Ask if anything ever worries them while they're online. Make sure they know that if they ever feel worried, they can get help by talking to you or another adult they trust.
- 3. Help your child to talk to trusted adults who can help them if they are worried: This includes you and other adults at home, as well as adults from wider family, school or other support services who they are able to contact at this time. Encourage them to draw a picture or write a list of their trusted adults.
- 4. <u>Be non-judgemental</u>: <u>Explain that you would never blame them</u> for anything that might happen online, and you will always give them calm, loving support.
- 5. Supervise their online activity: Keep the devices your child uses in communal areas of the house such as in the living room or kitchen where an adult is able to supervise. Children of this age should not access the internet unsupervised in private spaces, such as alone in a bedroom or bathroom.
- 6. <u>Talk about how their online actions affect others</u>: If your child is engaging with others online, remind them to consider how someone else might feel before they post or share something. If they are considering sharing a photo/video of somebody else, they should always ask permission first.
- 7. <u>Use 'SafeSearch'</u>: Most web search engines will have a 'SafeSearch' function, which will allow you to limit the content your child can access whilst online. Look out for the 'Settings' button on your web browser homepage, which is often shaped like a small cog.
- 8. <u>Parental controls:</u> Use the parental controls available on your home broadband and all internet enabled devices in your home. You can find out more about how to use parental controls by visiting your broadband provider's website.

9. <u>Use our school code of 'Zip it, Block it, Flag it at home</u> too: Zip it – Don't share your personal information

Block it – Block harmful or upsetting people or websites
Flag it – Tell an adult if you see something worrying online

10. Remind children that if something is making them unhappy when they are online at home or out and about then they need to make sure it is stopped and seek help. Using phones, screens, computers and tablets should be relaxing and a pleasant and safe activity to take part in, with parental support, at primary school age.
