





Headteacher message

Dear parents and carers,
We have had another great week of learning and progress. One of our Co-Chairs of Governors Mrs. Findlay visited last Friday and commented on the warm welcome from staff and children.

We have M&M Productions here again on Tuesday 27th January. They perform a Panto tailor-made for children at primary school age with professional actors and a wonderful set and costumes. Children join in, sing along and we always love it! The school can't afford extra opportunities like this and need to ask for your kind contributions please, to be paid online. Payments are now open. We offer different levels of contribution and it all helps a great deal. Thankyou in advance.

Parents have asked if we know the situation regarding mixed age classes and if they will be necessary in September due to the falling birth rate locally.

Pupil number information:

-We have some very small classes this year and it has been a financial strain on the school.
-Schools need full classes to be able to sustain themselves.
-Funding is based on pupil numbers for schools. We don't have extra funds to sustain very small classes.
-Local schools are all down on numbers and are facing financial constraint and the mixed age class prospect and some have mixed age classes already.
-We know from NHS birth rate information, from the local authority, that a fall in birth rate is expected to last a few years in Shoreham and Southwick.

We luckily have teachers at Glebe who have taught mixed age classes, including myself. Learning is still highly successful in such schools and they run very smoothly. It is a matter of mapping out learning across objectives, careful lesson planning and teacher expertise. We luckily have very

experienced and skilled teachers here at Glebe. An advantage of a smaller school is that we have lots of space for the children to learn in and can fully utilise our facilities and be creative with spaces to enhance learning.

It is not expected that we will need to mix many year groups next year. A key factor is knowing the September YR numbers and they are released this month to schools.

We help make our school a place where everyone feels welcome.


Pear Tree Nursery tours

On the move





YR – Spring 1 & Spring 2

We Love Books!



What we are up to: This term we are looking at a variety of texts. We are looking at both fiction and non-fiction books and doing lots of rhyming and extending vocabulary. Children are starting to use their phonics knowledge to sound out to read and write simple words and short captions. We focus on developing speech and language using Wellcomm in daily sessions and our weekly music lesson.

In maths, we are looking at numbers up to 5, mass and capacity and then understanding 6, 7 and 8. We will also be exploring length, height and time and then build an understanding of 9 and 10. Children have lots of opportunities to identify both numerals and quantity.

What else are we up to: Our classrooms have been reorganised to allow children to freely access all resources. There are designated areas for construction, small world, creative arts, communication and language as well as phonics, literacy and mathematics. Children are encouraged to learn through play as they use the resources to both consolidate and explore topics and concepts. On Fridays we do our weekly welly walk and learn about the environment and seasons.

Y1 - Spring 1

TOPIC FOCUS: Travel and Transport

BIG QUESTION: How has transport changed over time?



What we are up to: During this half-term, we will be learning about the different forms of transport and how transport has changed over time. We will be discovering information on the Wright brothers and look at how they changed aviation. Year 1 will also create their very own form of transport in a DT wheels and axles unit that they can play with themselves. In maths the children will focus on numbers to 20 including number bonds, fact families and addition and subtraction. In writing the children will use some great texts to develop their use of narrative structure and punctuation in writing.

Y2

Poles Apart: Why don't penguins need to fly?

What we are up to: This half term, we will be exploring the Arctic and Antarctic! We will look at where Antarctica is and what it is like there, as well as some of the polar animals that live there, particularly penguins. We will learn about how penguins are able to survive in Antarctica, and then compare it to the contrasting conditions of the Sahara Desert. We will also find out how Antarctica is different from the Arctic. We are looking forward to our Explorer Day, where the children can dress up as cold weather explorers and build their own Arctic dens in the classroom! Polar animals will also inspire our DT unit, where the children will make a moving picture using sliders and levers.

Y3

Light and Dark: How are shadows formed?



What we are up to: In the Spring term Year 3 children will be learning about the fascinating concept of light in our world. We will explore where light comes from and how it helps us to see the world around us. We will kick start our topic with creating shadow puppets, exploring how shadows are formed and that darkness is the absence of light. Children will experiment with creating their own shadows in their art lessons and be inspired to write poems about the light and dark and stories about shadows.
