Headteacher message

Dear parents and carers,

Welcome to Spring 1! The children have had a settled week and have come back full of learning enthusiasm! I hope you had a great Christmas break and Happy New Year!

I have emailed you this week about a word we need to stop which is "roasting". This involves groups of children in KS2 singling children out for name calling and it isn't for primary school. The children are too young and it is unkind. We have banned the game, as I explained in my message to parents in KS2 on Thursday. Miss. Jackson has put together some advice below to help parents.

Thankyou so much for supporting our Reindeer Day on Thursday 18th December. The children had a great Reindeer Day and all received a Reindeer headband and some reindeer food for the big night! We have raised an amazing £657 + £152.50 I Gift Aid!! Thankyou so much. Chestnut Tree House Children's Hospice are over the moon and share their thanks as well. We like to be prepared as much as possible here at Glebe and although we have the South Downs as some protection, you never know when snow may settle in the Winter months:

Glebe Snow Plan

On a day with heavy snow falls and settles...

1. The premises team come on site before 6am. They look to see if the school can be cleared and opened. They also check that the heating is working and water is running.
2. The premises team contact the Head by 6.10am or before. It is usually really clear if we can open or not but sometimes we have issues like staff not being able to get to work from further away to consider or water pipes freezing in the school.

3. By 6.15am Mrs. Crutchfield will be finding out who can get in and she'll then decide if we are safe to open or if we can manage some year groups, depending on how many staff can get in and safety factors. This can take a short while to gather together.
4. Mrs. Crutchfield decides if the school can be opened and lets team leaders know by 7.00am.
5. Team leaders let their teams know. Mrs. Domagala then gets on with the message to parents at 7.00am. We try to do this earlier if we can.
6. Mrs. Domagala messages parents via Arbor and adds a message to the front page of the website. She also notifies the local radio. Mrs. Crutchfield is in contact with other local schools by this time too.
7. If we have to close a class, department or the school then teachers will set learning for the day by sending a message via Arbor. Teachers may need time to return home first.
8. If the school is closed then PLAY will close too (childcare provider on site). Breakfast Club starts at 7.30am so we really aim to let parents know as early as we possibly can and we would be in contact with George Hance from first light.

We hope this is helpful to know.

Dear Parents and Carers of children in KS2,

Staff have alerted us to a new playground game, sometimes described by the children as "[roasting battles](#)," in KS2. We have banned this game as it was causing upset.

How you can help at home

- **Talk openly about kindness and respect:** Discuss with your child how jokes or "roasting" can easily cross a line and hurt others, even if that wasn't the intention.
- **Monitor online interactions:** If your child uses messaging apps or games with chat functions, keep an eye on the tone and language being used.

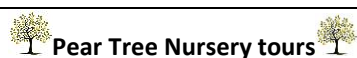
