

Autumn Term Topics Y4 to Y6

Year 4

The Terrible Tudors – Off with their heads!

In the Autumn term the children started the year with an afternoon dedicated to learning about the Tudor Rose and the Battle of Bosworth. They also had the opportunity to do a little Tudor dancing! We began to look at Who Henry VII was and what he was like as a King. The children were also able to learn about how Henry VIII became King and how he was different from his father. Through the history lessons the children will learn all about his wives and their fates as well as the reformation and the impact it had on England. In art, the children will be looking the artist Hans Holbein and the portraits he created of Henry VIII and will then create their own self portrait. The children will also write a non-chronological report on The Tudors in the style of the horrible histories' series. In Science, the children will be looking at sound, how it travels through different mediums what affects the pitch of sound. In French we will be introduced to days of the week along with different salutations. In PSHE we explore health and wellbeing and how to recognise emotions. This then develops into living in the wider world and rules and responsibility. In the final week the children will be undertaking an exciting Geography week investigating our local area with a walk around Southwick planned.

After half term, the children will learn about rainforests, climate zones and biomes around the world. Linked to their science work on habitats, they will learn that rainforests are home to a wide range of animal and plant life; they will appreciate the importance of rainforests to the wider world and how these special places are threatened by deforestation. Children will write stories set in the rainforest and poems about rainforests. Children will take part in a DT project to make rainforest themed marble runs. Year 5

Smashing Saxons! How did the Anglo-Saxons change the course of British History?

It's a busy and inspiring start to the year as we dive into our topic "Smashing Saxons!" We'll be uncovering how the Anglo-Saxons shaped British history – from mighty kings and kingdoms to the mystery of Sutton Hoo. Through drama, enquiry, and hands-on activities, children will explore what life was like in this fascinating era and even compare it with other times in history. Our learning doesn't stop there! In Science, we'll be investigating the properties of materials, while in DT we'll be getting creative with baking. Computing takes us into the world of coding, and in PE we'll be building skills in both dance and netball. French lessons will focus on vocabulary linked to school life, and in RE we'll be thinking about different ways people worship. We're also diving into brilliant books such as Water Tower and Catch a Lot, which will inspire our writing - from imaginative narratives to powerful speeches. In Maths, we'll begin the year by tackling place value and deepening our

number knowledge. And through PSHE, we'll be exploring health and wellbeing, relationships, and our role in the wider world.

Year 6

We will begin the year by immersing ourselves in R J Palacio's 'Wonder'.

We will begin our quest to understand the impact that disability, judgement, peer pressure and bullying has by using the text as a jumping off point to develop our own understanding of kindness and empathy. The creation of a class kindness box will support our reflections on the positive impact that our friends and classmates can have before creating art and literacy pieces to represent our views and feelings. In addition, we will be learning about animals and humans in science this term. We will learn about the circulation system and how we can keep our bodies and minds healthy and happy by considering the impact that diet, exercise, drugs and alcohol can have on the body. Our half term will end with an exciting geography week where we develop our map work skills and visit Shoreham Port to learn about the vital resources which enter and leave the UK thorough this port.

After half term, our learning journey is packed with exciting topics across all subjects. In history, we will dive into the fascinating world of Ancient Greece, exploring its rich culture, mythology, and lasting influence on modern society. We'll learn about key figures, events, and how ancient Greek ideas have shaped the world we know today. In art, we will be developing our creativity and precision as we create stunning mosaics. Inspired by ancient and modern designs, this project will teach us about patterns, colour, and the art of storytelling through imagery. Our science lessons will take us on an exploration of the animal kingdom. We'll investigate animals and their habitats, focusing on the differences between vertebrates (animals with backbones) and invertebrates (animals without backbones). This will help us understand the amazing diversity of life on Earth, how different species adapt to their environments, and why protecting habitats is so important for all living things.
