

Year 5





What we are up to:

We are travelling back to the Mayan Civilisation to learn about their influence on our world today as well as comparing them to other historic periods and creating some Mayan inspired artwork. We will also be inspired by the Real-Life Mysteries information guides to inspire writing our own guides about a topic of our choice. Meanwhile, in Science, we will be learning about life cycles of plants and animals. We are also very excited to be learning the clarinet with the help of expert teachers from the West Sussex Music Service. Year 4



The Victorians – How has life changed for children since the Victorian era?

### What we are up to:

In summer term 1, our history unit focuses on comparisons between life in Victorian England and modern life, with a particular emphasis on the experiences of children. Our key text of Oliver Twist provides a glimpse into life in Victorian towns whilst immersive experiences in school (and at Preston Manor) will give children a greater understanding of what it was like to be a child in Victorian times. This will link with our writing units, where the children will apply for a job at Preston Manor. They will write a persuasive letter on why they are the best child for the job. These letters will be delivered on the day of our visit, and the children will find out who has been successful. In science, they will learn about electricity. Looking closely at electrical circuits, insulators and conductors. The children will have the chance to make their own electrical circuits with different components. In design and technology, they will have the opportunity to design and make their own torch! The children will be able to combine their science knowledge with D&T to create a torch with an electrical circuit inside.

Year 3



For the summer term in Year 3, our exciting topic is 'Brighton Rocks'! This term, we will embark on an engaging journey through the rich history of our beloved local city, Brighton.

Our young historians will dive deep into how Brighton has evolved over the ages, starting from its pre-historic roots through to the bustling Victorian era, and discovering the vibrant seaside holiday destination it is today. We will explore what makes Brighton so special and unique, considering its stunning geographical features as well as the incredible human stories that have shaped our community.

To enhance their learning experience, we are thrilled to announce a visit to the Brighton Museum and Art Gallery, where students will connect with our city's past and present first hand. In addition to our history studies, the children will engage in various subjects that complement our topic. In Science, they will investigate the fascinating world of plants. Our French lessons will introduce them to simple conversational skills, including asking 'How are you?' In RE, we will learn about Sikhism, fostering an appreciation for diverse cultures and beliefs. Creativity thrives in our Design Technology sessions, where students will design and create their very own tote bags to celebrate 'Brighton Rocks.' In Music, the children will embark on a musical journey as they learn to play the ukulele, adding a melodic touch to our exploration of Brighton's vibrant culture.

### Year 6



Topic: Fairness and Justice Was Robin Hood a hero or villain? What we are up to:

This term, we are diving into the world of Robin Hood! Was he a brave hero who helped the poor—or a law-breaking outlaw? Was he a real person, or just a legend? Our topic explores the big ideas of fairness and justice, both in the past and today. We'll be thinking about rules, rights, and how our justice system works. Is it fair? What would Robin Hood say? In Science, we'll be shining a light! We're learning about how light travels, how shadows appear, and what happens when light bounces or bends. In Art, we're getting creative with printing. We'll try out exciting techniques to design and make our own prints.
