



**FOOD GLORIOUS FOOD** What do people eat around the world?



What we are up to: For our first half term in Year 1, the children will be exploring foods from around the world. The children will learn about the different continents and how food varies across the world. They will develop their kitchen skills using a range of tools and learn how to prepare certain ingredients. The children will apply their knowledge of cooking and preparing food for when they make their own delicious pizzas! They will also have the chance to do some food tasting of different foods from around the world! The children will look at the text 'The Lonely Beast' by Chris Judge

and have the chance to tell their version of the story using puppets. They will also have the chance to write about a topic they are knowledgeable about and share with the class. There will be lots of counting and learning numbers to 20 in so many fun ways! The children are going to enjoy their first term in year 1!

CASTLE CONQUERORS Why were castles built?




What we are up to: The children in Year 2 will begin the half term by exploring what life in England was like under the rule of William the Conqueror – the first King of England under the Norman reign. They will examine his influence on life during the Norman period – including the Battle of Hastings as well as how his legacy has shaped our country today, with a particular focus on castles. Our castle theme will also inspire our artwork this half term, as we will be creating castle pictures inspired by Paul Klee's artwork *Castle and the Sun*.

#### Year 3



**STONE AGE BONE AGE** *Were the Stone Age people just simple hunter gatherers?* 

What we are up to: Through this fascinating History topic we will find out how the lives of the Stone Age people changed over time. We will investigate how these primitive folk were not just simple hunter gathers living a nomadic lifestyle to survive. They were also a people of art, culture and they possibly took part in religious ceremonies and rituals. We will also be creating narrative stories based on a range of quality picture books, and we will create a survival guide for a Stone

Age time traveller! In Science we will be investigating rocks and soils, and we will learn the three basic types of rock and how they are formed. In the final week the children will be undertaking an exciting Geography project investigating our local river, and we will catch the train to Shoreham for an exciting field trip.
