We are thrilled to announce that Glebe Primary has been awarded an Eco Schools Green Flag award! This is to recognise the steps that we are taking as a whole school community to reduce waste, promote biodiversity on our school grounds, save energy and promote sustainable ways of travel to school. The application process involved a survey of nine different areas of our school building and grounds to show the ways in which we are promoting environmental awareness. This included the work we are doing in our forest school area, our class Eco teams, our sustainable travel initiatives and our outreach into the wider community through litter picks and beach cleans. Look out for our Green Flag going up soon! We shall also be receiving our donated

Powerful Knowledge...

Raise combined outcomes for all in Y5 and Y6.

Our Y6 Summer cohort were a lovely year group who shone in so many ways. The year group had 60 children in total with high need levels e.g. 25% on the SEND register. Each year this number fluctuates and this was an unusually high year for us regarding additional need. We had good progress over the year but achieving age expected scores for some was a challenge. As we had a dip in outcomes last Summer, we are now focusing on provision in Y5 and Y6 to ensure we are giving all children every possible chance. This includes continuing targeted intervention, building our high quality teaching further and focusing on core skills. We are also working with families on things like regular reading at home and arithmetic practice.

The Best from Everyone..

To continue to advance the opportunities, progress and learning confidence of all disadvantaged pupils.

Our attendance for all pupils has risen in recent years, since the pandemic, which is very good news! This is true for all groups. We have done well with phonics outcomes last year and reading is our strongest subject as a school. Maths is improving in terms of outcomes for disadvantaged groups. We need to support disadvantaged children with writing primarily as that is a weaker subject for this group. We are ensuring that handwriting is taught daily across the school and that children who struggle with sentence development, grammar, spelling and vocabulary range are given support in class and out of class to be able to engage fully. Staff have had extra training on meeting those needs.

Develop EYFS curriculum and opportunities to ensure a GLD is achieved by the vast majority of children.

Our GLD (good level of development across 7 areas of learning) was in line with national outcomes in the Summer, which is a good achievement. Phonics for the last YR cohort was very positive also. We have very good provision for our nursery and YR classes and this year we are just upskilling and updating ourselves with the support of United Learning. We have a new curriculum to follow from United Learning and we hope to be even more ambitious with our outcomes as a result. A good start in early years is essential for every child. *Education with Character...*

Belonging: Embed and sustain family boards and refresh Glebe's 'Valued Experiences': Nursery to Y6.

The school has 'Family Boards' in class and this is a chance to celebrate and get to know one another so that each class is a team, with a family atmosphere; where children care for one another and work towards class goals e.g. shared marble time treats for reaching NIC token challenges. Our 'Valued Experiences' are extra fun opportunities built into the curriculum which progress year on year e.g. making food, nature walks, going to the Library, performing to an audience, growing plants etc. Great life experiences! This year is a refresh year.

Leadership in Every Role...

Pupil leadership: Embed and sustain responsibilities in every classroom, build on existing school leadership e.g. Eco School reps, School Council and House Captains. Refresh and enhance the House Point system.

Each class have jobs for all! Everyone is important and everyone has a role in making sure we look after our learning space and one another. Some children also take part in committees and Y6 all have responsibilities around school e.g. Librarian, Technician, Play Leader etc.

Continuous Improvement...

Refreshing the school grounds and building over five years by zoning priority areas. Develop the use of the refreshed school grounds through the curriculum.

2024-2025: Forest School area open for learning, house on site developed and a number of projects e.g. new flooring etc. 2025-2026: Open the house on site, Y5/6 toilet refurbishment, replace old single glazed windows and new music room opened. Lunchtime sports leader to develop zones further and play opportunities on each playground. 2026-2027: New pond area and new KS1 outdoor classroom
